

My name is Jaime Rhodes. I am the victim advocate for Crisis Connection Inc. (CCI) and at CCI, I work with victims of domestic violence and sexual assault in Perry and South Spencer County. We envision a community free of behaviors that causes physical, psychological or sexual

harm to others. We promote individual accountability and respect to end domestic violence and sexual assault through confidential crisis intervention, victim advocacy, primary prevention education and collaboration with community partners. October is known as Domestic Violence Awareness Month. We are asking the congregation to join us in raising awareness for victims of domestic violence. Your voice helps empower victims and makes leaps towards preventing violence in our community. In the month of October, the church will be collecting items that could potentially help clients that come to CCI in emergency situations. Items that CCI collects are: paper towels, toilet paper, deodorant (women and mens), toothpaste, toothbrushes, hairbrushes, mouthwash, shampoo, conditioner, body wash, lotion, soap, gift cards to Wal-Mart, Dollar Tree, Dollar General, local gas cards or grocery store certificates or






