These forty days of Lent focus our thoughts and prayers on the grave reality that we are doomed by sin and in need of a Savior. Only the Son of God can pay the price and set His people free. May the season of Lent draw you closer to the One who now saves you, Christ Jesus our Lord.

Church of Christ in Tell City. This is a Christian men's project. The annual breakfast started in 1976 and all men and boys are invited to attend.


LADIES LENTEN PRAYER COFFEES

TRINITY, DARMSTADT PLANS TO OPEN NEW PARISH HALL AND PRESCHOOL



Serving the Lord in Darmstadt

The Lord is doing great things at Trinity Lutheran Darmstadt in Evansville. By the end of the year, a new parish hall of the church will open, which includes a fellowship hall, kitchen, offices, restrooms, and classrooms. Next fall, they will open an early childhood ministry in their day school building.

Lutheran education has had a long tradition at Trinity. In 1853, the church opened a one-room Lutheran school, which expanded and continued for over 150 years. In 2010, the school closed due to funding issues. In 2017, Trinity voted to reopen the school as an early childhood ministry offering preschool and childcare.

Rev. Stan Temme noted that the 19:10 Project, a revitalization process with the Transforming Churches Network, was an important part of creating an outward-focused mission and ministry for the church. In addition, the church completed the Genesis Project with the help of Dr. Jon Mielke, former executive counselor for Christian education, Mrs. Kathy Frank, early childhood consultant for the Indiana District, and LCMS consultant, Mr. Stu Tietz. Demographic studies from the project showed there were over 1700 children, ages 0-4, within a five-mile radius of the church. The congregation realized their vacant day school building could meet a vital need in the community, while providing a quality Lutheran education to young learners.

With assistance from the Indiana District Education Department, the church called Breenna Smith, an LCMS Commissioned Teacher, as the new director of the early childhood ministry. She was installed in September 2018. Rev. Temme said. "We're hoping to fill the halls with children, laughter, and the love of Jesus."


