LWML EAST/WEST ZONE HOSTING EVANGELISM SEMINAR AT ST. JOHN'S, EVANSTON

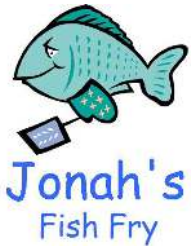

LCMS' MINISTRY TO THE ARMED FORCES



Since the Civil War, Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod pastors have served as military chaplains. Today, the LCMS' Ministry to the Armed Forces supports 173 chaplains. Among these chaplains, 70 are active duty LCMS chaplains and 80 are serving Reserve and National Guard units. Currently, one of these Reserve/Guard chaplains is mobilized in Bahrain. LCMS' Ministry to the Armed Forces also supports 23 Civil Air Patrol chaplains.

Our active duty members usually work on a base or post, with a large support staff to care for their needs, such as financial counseling, baby-sitting, health care, etc. However, our reserve community and their families are often located large distances from those support structures. Our hope is that our LCMS congregations can reach out to these families, especially when their loved ones are deployed, and help care for many of their needs. **We will calibrate Armed Forces Sunday is May 19th.**

SUPPORT CONTINUES FOR NEW MISSION OUTREACH IN RICHMOND, KENTUCKY



The Indiana District is continuing to pursue their goal of raising \$150,000 for Outreach Kentucky, a new mission initiative serving the Richmond, Kentucky area. As of February 11, \$70,220 has been raised toward the goal. Once \$150,000 is reached, the District can apply for an additional \$100,000 through the New Ministry Initiative Matching Grant. The total amount of

\$250,000 would enable the board of directors to call and provide living expenses for a missionary for at least three years.

So why choose to support Outreach Kentucky? The need for an LCMS congregation in that area is urgent. Richmond is the third largest city in the bluegrass region of Kentucky, but many of its residents have no religious affiliation. The city is also home to Eastern Kentucky University, a bustling college town with the potential for a campus ministry. With your help, we can reach the people of Richmond for Christ and provide a campus ministry to young adults for three years.

The District hopes to achieve this goal by 2021. However, if our goal is not met, then donors will be approached about applying the funds to another project at that time. It is our hope that the remaining funds will be raised this year, so we can apply for a matching grant and begin to share the good news of Jesus Christ with the residents of Richmond.

CTS OPENS REGISTRATION FOR CHRIST ACADEMY



Christ Academy consists of three important elements: confessional catechesis, liturgical worship and a fun life together. This tradition of learning, worship and fun provides an incredible two weeks of summer for young men and women in high school, especially for those considering a future in church work. Christ Academy consists of two schools, Timothy School for men and Phoebe School for women.

During Timothy School and Phoebe School, young men & women have the opportunity to take eight different classes in theology over the course of the two weeks, taught by the world-class faculty at CTSFW. Students also experience the joy of living a life of worship as we gather together around God's Word four times a day. All of our worship is drawn from the *Lutheran Service Book* and is focused on the person and work of Jesus Christ.

Finally, students have fun at Christ Academy. The academy is packed full of great events, from capture the flag, bowling, and ultimate Frisbee to a minor league baseball game and a Saturday of entertainment in Fort Wayne. Our students both enjoy themselves and build lasting friendships along the way.

Whether you are interested in becoming a pastor or are just interested in theology, Christ Academy is the event for you. Spots are limited, so check us out and join the tradition!

Frequently Asked Questions

When?

Christ Academy is June 16–29, 2019.

Who is allowed to attend?

Timothy School is open to young men enrolled in high school, ages 13-18.

Phoebe School is open to young women enrolled in high school, ages 13-18.

Where will I stay?

You will stay in dormitory rooms on the Seminary campus, two students per room. Each room has two closets, two chairs and two beds. Bedding and towels will be provided.

What will I eat?

Students will eat their meals in the campus dining hall as well as at some local eateries in Fort Wayne.

What will I study?

Christ Academy Students will study the four main areas of theology:

- ◆ Exegetical (biblical interpretation)
- ◆ Systematic (a systematic presentation of our Christian faith in the contemporary world)
- ◆ Historical (how the Church throughout the ages has confessed the faith)
- ◆ Practical (the application of theology to life)

All classes are taught by ordained pastors; most teachers are professors at Concordia Theological Seminary. In addition, the Concordia Universities from across the country will provide community service projects and presentations.

What do I need to bring?

Bring a Bible, two-week's worth of clothes (free laundry in the dorms is available). Besides casual clothes, students will need formal clothes for church and chapel services (meaning a jacket and tie), toiletries, any necessary medicine and some spending money.

What opportunities are available outside the classroom?

Students will go off campus for a Tincaps baseball game and mission opportunities in the community. Participants will sing in the Christ Academy choir and have recreation opportunities such as flag football, soccer, basketball, ultimate Frisbee, Capture the Flag and more.

What is the cost?

The current cost of \$600 (or \$400 for returning participants) is all inclusive, covering housing, meals, Christ Academy polo shirt and other events. **Need-based financial aid is available** by contacting the academy director at ChristAcademy@ctsfw.edu.
